
ACCOMMODATION

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INSTRUCTIONS FOR ABSTRACT PREPARATION

Each submitted abstract must include the following information:

- title in bold print, 12 points, centered
- names(s) of authors(s) with the name of the presenting author underlined
- affiliation(s) of the author(s)
- an indication of whether the presenter will be competing for the P.H. Jones student award (Note: poster presentations are not eligible for the competition)
- text font to be Times, 12 point with paragraphs single-spaced
- a note indicating whether the abstract is submitted for an oral or a poster presentation.



The presentation/poster should deal with new concepts, new applications of established concepts, or new evidence of water quality or environmental degradation or rehabilitation. It may describe substantial improvements of existing theories and approaches or progress in our abilities to deal with water quality or environmental problems. The abstract must establish that the project is well developed, that general theory or experimental procedure has been established, and that some data have been collected and subjected to analysis.

Problem statement, objectives, methodology, results, conclusions, and recommendations should be presented. **Abstracts should be limited to 500 words.**

PHILIP H. JONES STUDENT AWARD

The CAWQ sponsors a competition for the "best presentation" made by a young water professional (YWP, less than 35 years old) on their research. This award was created as a memorial to the late Philip H. Jones who was a founding and long-standing member of CAWQ. This award includes:

- a cash prize of \$200 at the closing ceremony of the symposium
- a one-year membership in CAWQ, including a subscription to the *Water Quality Research Journal of Canada*
- the publication of the name of the student in an issue of the journal and on the CAWQ website
- a certificate acknowledging his/her performance; and a formal invitation from the president of the CAWQ to submit his/her work for peer review and eventual publication in the *Water Quality Research Journal of Canada*
