- Flood planning and flood control

Abstracts will be reviewed by the conference organizing committee and a decision will be sent to applicants before February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

**WHAT TO INCLUDE IN YOUR ABSTRACT:** Your abstract should be limited to a maximum of 2,000 characters. Abstracts describing experimental studies should address the following: Introduce your topic, describe your methods, summarize your most important findings, list your main conclusions, and explain the relevance of your results to the research and/or engineering communities. Abstracts describing in-depth literature reviews, desktop studies, product development, and real world projects are also welcome and should provide enough detail for judges and attendees to understand your methods, results, and the relevance of the work. Please include a short bio (<50 words) at the bottom of your abstract.
