A major goal of the Canadian Association on Water Quality is to showcase the talents of students who conduct water quality research. The CAWQ sponsors a competition for the "**best presentation**" of a research paper made by a student at each of the regional symposia on water quality research.

The **Philip H. Jones award** was created as a memorial to the founder of the CAWQ.

This award includes:

- A cash prize of 200\$ granted to the prize winner
- A one-year membership in the CAWQ, including a subscription to the Water Quality Research Journal of Canada
- The publication of the named of the student in an issue of the journal and on the CAWQ website
- A certificate acknowledging his/her performance and a formal invitation from the President of the CAWQ to submit his/her work for peer review and eventual publication in the Water Quality Research Journal of Canada

Symposium objectives

General objectives of the symposium are to stimulate discussion on recent Canadian research projects on water quality and facilitate the information exchange between universities, consultants, industries and governments.

Context

Transversal subjects, such as the crisis provoked by the increase of cyanobacteria in Eastern Township lakes, the assessment of the Quebec Water Policy, 5 years after its implementation and the consultations lead by the CCME on the Canada-wide Strategy for the Management of Municipal Wastewater Effluent, require scientific, technological, political, economic and social answers. The symposium will be an excellent opportunity to report progress on these recent issues.

Topics of interests

Speakers will be asked to submit abstracts concerning one or more of the following themes:

Water quality (advances in analytical technologies and methods, emerging contaminants, fate and impact of contaminants, effects of climate change on water quality, etc.)

Wastewater and stormwater treatment (advances in treatment technologies, disinfection, sludge treatment and management, etc.)

Drinking water treatment (advances in treatment technologies, elimination of micropollutants, taste, odour and cyanotoxins, source water protection, bottled water quality, etc.)

Social, economic and political issues related to water quality (new strategies for wastewater effluent management, policy and legislation, socio-economic impacts, sustainable development, etc.)

Sustainable and Green Energy (green house gases reduction and impact on climate change, water and wastewater management to reduce GHG).

Hydrology (advances in modeling, water quality and management)

Abstract submission (deadline)

Authors are invited to submit an abstract of **500 words according with the template** given at the following email address:

CAWQ2011@ete.inrs.ca

Deadline for submission is fixed to **August 15th 2011**

The abstract must include:

- Type of presentation (oral or poster)
- Title in bold
- First and last name of all authors (underline the one who will do the presentation)
- Complete affiliation of each authors and status of the one who will do the presentation
- Indicate if the presentation is part of the student contest for the Philip H. Jones Award

The abstract must contain an introduction to the problematic, the objectives of the work, methodology, results and conclusion and/or recommendations. Abstract must be clear and concise.

Symposium planning

The symposium will be held October 7th the Institut National de la Recherche Scientifique, Centre Eau Terre Environnement, (INRS-ETE) (490 rue de la couronne, Québec, G1K 0B6).

Oral presentations will last 20 minutes including a 5 minute question period.

One poster session is also scheduled during that day. Authors will be present to comment their work and answer questions.

Manuscript submission to the Water Quality Research Journal of Canada

Authors are invited to submit a manuscript of their presentation for publication in the Water Quality Research Journal of Canada, published 4 times a year. After the usual revision process by WQRJC, best articles will be selected for publication.
